What is the difference between being a Friend or Sydenham Garden and a Member of Sydenham Garden?

A Friend has agreed to support Sydenham Garden by giving a regular financial donation but has no legal right to take part in running Sydenham Garden.

A member has a legal right to take part in the running of Sydenham Garden but has not agreed to give money. We wanted to make Membership free to encourage as many people as possible to become involved in the running of Sydenham Garden.

You can be both a Friend and a Member if you wish. Alternatively you can be either a Member or a Friend.
